## Pheasant Hunters Oil Shotguns in Preparation For Season Opening

The pheasant, quail and water fowl season in Jackson County, all open at noon on Friday, October 29th. The pheasant season in all open counties except Malheur and the Summer Lake Valley will extend through November 2. In Malheur County the season will extend through November 7. In the Summer Lake Valley, which is being used as a test area by the Game Commission, the season for pheasants will be concurrent with the waterfowl season which is October 29 through November 14 and December 23 through January 8. Both openings will be at noon. Bag limits for Kingneck pheasant this year are two cocks in any one day and four for the season except in Malheur county where the limit is two cocks a day and six for the season and in the Summer Lake Valley where the bag limit is two pheasants of either sex a day and not more than four in possession. Pheasants are polygamous, he pointed out, and fine bird hatches can be expected with a sex ratio of one cock to five hens. If every hunter this season will use extra caution to see that the pheasant hens are protected it will be a big step toward increasing the bird population of Oregon for next year. 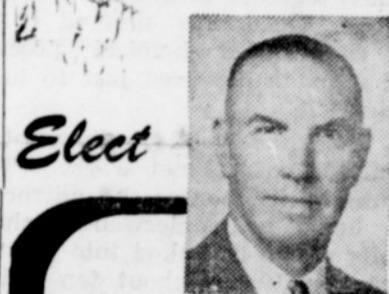
