Meridith Speaks Here Dec. 3, 4, & 5

John L. Meredith, well-known news commentator and analyst over Chicago stations, editor of the weekly newspaper THE BIBLE AND THE NEWS which correlates world news and the Bible, has been engaged to speak in Assembly of God Church, December 3, 4, & 5th.

"Uncle John," as he is familiarly known to radio listeners in the Middle West is to bring a lecture or series of lectures on current events and the Bible.



Rev. Klingsheim explains that Mr. Meredith uses up-to-the-minute news-reel type motion pictures to illustrate his talks on world affairs and the Bible, and that these pictures have an educational value for all who are at all interested in present events. "Palestine, for instance," says Rev. Klingsheim "is regarded as a land of unusual interest to

much of the world as the Jews seek to establish a nation for themselves in that land. The struggle to establish this new nation, Israel, and the results already accomplished in uprooting the desert are shown in motion pictures, and Mr. Meredith says these pictures make the news from Palestine more real to all who see them."
