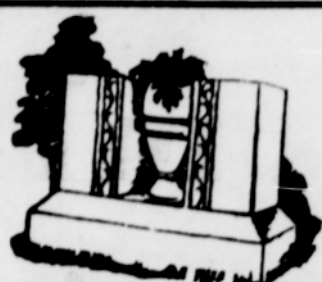
The supper is being sponsored by the Homemakers' class. Dessert and coffee will be provided and each one attending is asked to bring a covered dish and his own table service.

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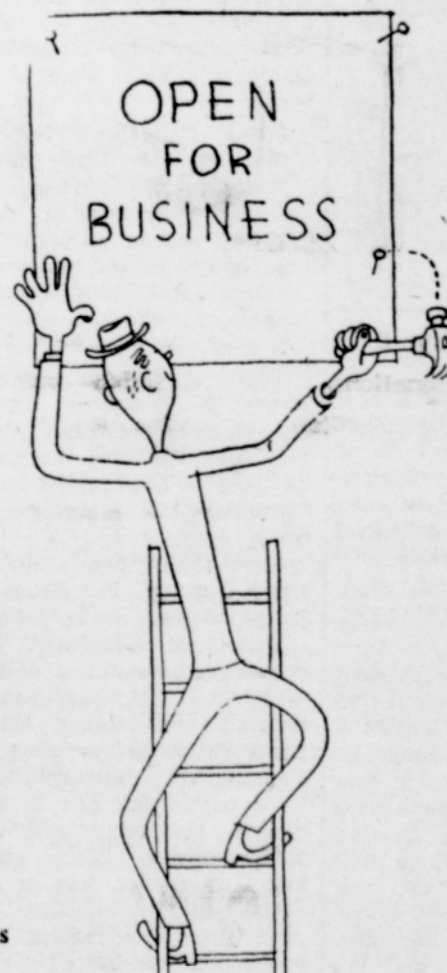
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
