HELMS and JANE DOE HELMS, his wife if married and living, and their respective unknown heirs, if deceased; and any and all other parties or persons unknown claiming any right, title, estate, lien or interest in or to the real property hereinafter described. IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON you and each of you are hereby required to appear and answer the Complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit on or before the last day of four weeks from the date of the first publication of this Summons, and if you fail so to appear and answer said Complaint, for want thereof, the Plaintiffs will apply to the Court for the relief demanded in their Complaint succinctly stated as follows, to-wit:

That a decree be entered adjudicating any and all right, title, estate, lien or claim which you or any of you have or claim to have in, to, or upon the real property situated in Jackson County, Oregon, and now in the possession of the Plaintiffs, C. M. Litwiler and Hattie Litwiler, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the most Southerly corner of Lot One (1) in Block "H" of the Town of Talent, Jackson County, Oregon, according to the official plat thereof, now of record in Vol. 19, page 230, of the Deed Records of Jackson County, Oregon; thence Northwesterly 111.0 feet along the Southeastery line of said Lot; thence Northwesterly parallel with First Street, 60.0 feet to the Northwesterly line of Lot 2 in said Block; thence Southwesterly along said line 111.0 feet to the most Westerly corner of said Lot; and thence Southeastery, along the Southwesterly line of said Lot 2 and 60.0 feet to the point of beginning.

And declaring any and all such claims to be null and void; and declaring that the said Plaintiffs are the owners in fee simple of said premises and of the whole thereof, free and clear of any and all right, title, estate, lien or interest of said Defendants, or any of them, and that each and all of the Defendants herein and each and all persons claiming, or to claim by, through or under them, or any of them, be forever enjoined, restrained and barred from asserting, attempting to establish or claiming any right, title, estate, lien or interest in or to said property, or any portion thereof, and that Plaintiffs title to said premises be forever quieted and set at rest.
