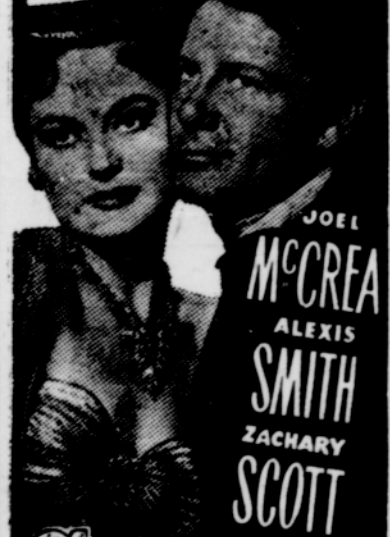

The class of 1899, which will be celebrating its fiftieth anniversary, included forty-one graduates of which the twenty-seven were women and fourteen, men. Although its ranks have been depleted by deaths, many of the class still live in Oregon, although members of it may be found throughout the United States.
