Kris Kringle's Cookies



"How to Make Christmas Come Sooner" could be the real title of this story! For what child does not love the anticipation of Christmas almost as much as the day itself?

Let's set the youngsters up in the cookie-making business by having mother first make up two batches of cookie dough—one for regular sugar cookies and the other for chocolate cookies. Then everyone joins in cutting with a couple of fancy-shaped cutters. Various decorations are added before baking: colored sugar crystals, red cinnamon candies, nuts, currants and citron. When the cookies come out of the oven, the fun really begins with fancy wrappings—and a stolen bite or two!

- Old-Fashioned Sugar Cookies**
 - 2 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
 - 2 tps. calumet baking powder
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 cup butter or shortening
 - 1 cup sugar
 - 2 eggs, well beaten
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
- Chocolate Cookies**
 - 2 1/4 cups sifted cake flour
 - 1 1/2 tps. calumet baking powder
 - 1/2 teaspoon soda
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 1/2 cup butter or shortening
 - 1 cup sugar
 - 2 eggs, well beaten
 - 3 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted

Banana Prune Meringue Pie Bound To Be A Family Favorite

The recipes your family likes best you don't mind repeating over and over. Nobody grumbles about having a dish too often when it's a favorite. To make this delicious and unusual pie, select bananas that are fully ripe, the kind that have yellow peel flecked with brown. That means bananas at the peak of ripeness, flavor and sweetness. A pie to try for sure is Banana Prune Meringue.

- Banana Prune Meringue Pie**
- 2 cups dried prunes
 - 3/4 cup water
 - 3 egg yolks, slightly beaten
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
 - 1 tablespoon butter or margarine
 - 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 - 2 ripe bananas*
 - 1 baked 9-inch pie shell
- Meringue
- 3 egg whites
 - 6 tablespoons sugar
- Beat egg whites until stiff. Add sugar gradually and contin-

Five Jackson County Youths Awarded "Service Under Fire" Badges By K.O.G.

SALEM, DEC. 7—(Special)—Eighty-one Oregon boys and girls, an all-time record number, have been cited by the Keep Oregon Green Association for outstanding efforts during the past summer in reducing man-caused forest fires. Each boy and girl singled out for special honors has been awarded a special "Service Under Fire" badge, according to Albert Wiesendanger, Executive Secretary of K.O.G.

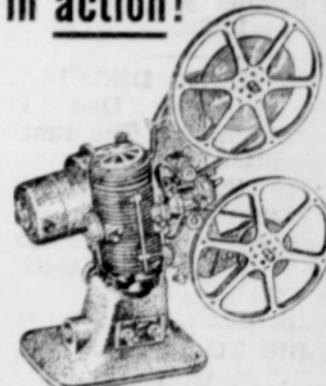
Five of the youngsters are from Jackson county including, Glenn Jones and Adelbert McMillen, both of Central Point, and Marilyn J. Gast, James Young and Roger Pinkstaff, all of Medford.

Youngest of the winners are two 8-year-olds, Don Wiesenger, Detroit, and Tommy Hirone, Salem. Marion County had 18 winners to lead the list and Mul-

zens reported grass, brush and forest fires. In some cases they actually fought the fires. The alertness of these youngsters has been of tremendous help, Wiesendanger explained, for fires caught before they have a chance to spread, are easy to put out.

To qualify for a Service Under Fire badge, a Green Guard must submit an actual report of his individual effort together with a certificate by an adult. Many more of the 30,000 Green Guards undoubtedly qualified for this high honor, Wiesendanger said, and although they did not send in their reports, we do appreciate their contribution to Oregon citizenship.
