

## Chiropractors Protest Oregon Athletic Policy

Oregon chiropractors have threatened to appeal to the state board of control unless the Oregon School Activities association abandons its discriminatory policy against chiropractic physicians in the high school athletic insurance program.

Meeting in the Multnomah hotel Thursday night, a committee of the Oregon Association of Chiropractic Physicians heard a Portland high school coach declare the majority of coaches prefer to have injured players treated by chiropractors because "they give them immediate relief and get them back into action quicker."

Paul Bennett, Franklin high school football coach, said that the chiropractic treatments given his players by Dr. Gordon V. Pefley "made the difference between having a first division instead of a second division team."

"Dr. Pefley, whose services were donated because the School Activities association refuses to pay for treatments of chiropractors, took care of nine injured players on my Franklin team, and got them all back in the lineup within one week." He said it had been his experience that when injured athletes seek treatment from medical doctors for sprains or dislocated bones, they are told to "go home and soak it in hot water and come back in two weeks and we'll see what it looks like."

Statements were read from a number of other high school coaches throughout the state, who strongly recommended that chiropractic physicians be recognized in the insurance program. Spokesman of the Chiropractic Association said they had been turned down consistently in their efforts to arrange a conference between their group and the Oregon School Activities association, which manages the athletic insurance program.

They said that Thomas Pigott, executive secretary-treasurer of the OSAA, had been "extremely uncooperative" about giving the chiropractic physicians a chance to state their case before his association.

## VA Reports Increased G. I. Insurance

The Veterans Administration reveals that more than 7,149,000 National Service Life Insurance policies, held by World War II Vets are now in force — a 28 per cent increase over the 5,595,000 policies that were active three years ago.

Twenty-four per cent of the G. I. insurance policies have been converted to permanent plans of insurance, according to the VA. In January, 1947, permanent policies amounted to only 12 per cent of the total.

The average NSLI policy today is 5,760, as compared with a \$6,096 average in January, 1947.

In the Pacific Northwest area, active G. I. insurance accounts held by veterans of World War II total 175,286, out of a possible 580,000, or slightly more than one-third of the active and inactive accounts administered by the Seattle VA District Office.

More than 60,000 of these policies, or 35 per cent of the active accounts, have been converted to permanent policies, as compared to 18,664, or 10 per cent, three years ago.

## Book Reviews . . .

### "The Road Ahead" By John T. Flynn

The intellectual-Left has become increasingly active and dangerously powerful of late, particularly in the three fields of education, religion and writing. In the last field mentioned left-wing writers are assiduously turning out propaganda by way

of magazines, newspapers, books, theatre, cinema, radio and even the "comics."

It was therefore a refreshing surprise to find a recent book which dares pull back the curtain on what is happening in this country and the world. Unlike the majority of today's writers, the author does not ballyhoo sugar-coated socialism as a panacea for all ills but rather presents in stark realism the only possible cure.

In a book of compelling interest, loaded with incontrovertible facts which are substantiated by documentary proof, John T. Flynn gives his readers food for many long thoughts. Whether one agrees with his conclusions or not, the challenge of so forthright a book cannot but stimulate thinking Americans to an honest appraisal of today's crisis in government.

Mr. Flynn has written several previous books analysing and exposing the evils of the "creeping revolution" and its leaders, but in "The Road Ahead" he makes clear the blood bond existing between the Fabians of Britain and the Social Planners of the U. S.

We warn you however, this is no book to choose for a peaceful evening's browsing.
