UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Jan. 19 (Special) - Dedication of the first three buildings completed under the University's \$6,000,000 building program will be held on the campus Saturday, Feb. 11, with Governor Douglas McKay slated to be on hand to assist with the ceremonies.

Carson hall, new \$1,600,000 dormitory for women, the school of music addition, and Villard hall with the University Theatre

addition will be dedicated at ceremonies carried by radio stations throughout the state. Preliminary plans are now being worked out by a student and faculty committee.

Officiating at the dedication program, to be held in Carson hall, will be Edgar W. Smith, Portland, president of the state board of higher education; R. E. Kleinsorge, Silverton, chairman of the building committee of the state board; Dr. H. K. Newburn, university president, and the Governor.

Open house will be held in the buildings following the dedication. One older building will be included in the open house. The

Home Economics department, will be celebrating its 10th anniversary in its new facilities in Chapman Hall that weekend and will participate in the program. A tea is planned by the department during the afternoon. Special activities have also been planned by the music school faculty and in the evening a performance of "Winteret" will be presented in the University Theatre.

Meeting on the campus over the Dedication Weekend will be two conventions - the Oregon Broadcaster association, and the Northwest Drama conference. Both groups will take part in the weekend activities.
