Motor Transport Safety Course Scheduled By OSC

OREGON STATE COLLEGE - The seventh annual motor vehicle fleet supervisors course for those concerned with safety and conservation in motor transportation, has been scheduled for the Public Service building in Portland February 13 to 17. The course is conducted by the Oregon State college school of engineering with the cooperation of more than a dozen local, state and federal agencies. Attending will be fleet owners, operators, safety engineers and supervisors, insurance company safety engineers, transportation officials and personnel directors, and others interested in these fields. Martin Coopey, associate professor of civil engineering at O.S.C. and Sidney King, director of the safety department, Oregon State Motor association, are co-directors of the course. Amos E. Neyhart, head of the Institute of Public Safety, Pennsylvania State college, nationally recognized authority in this field, heads a staff of eight instructors for the course.

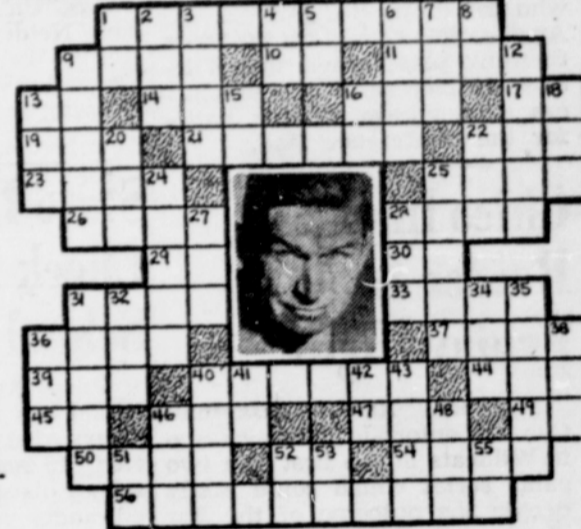
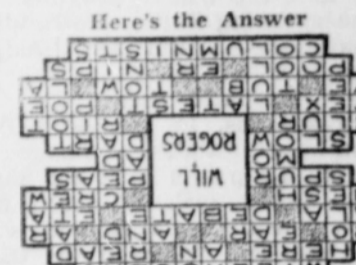
