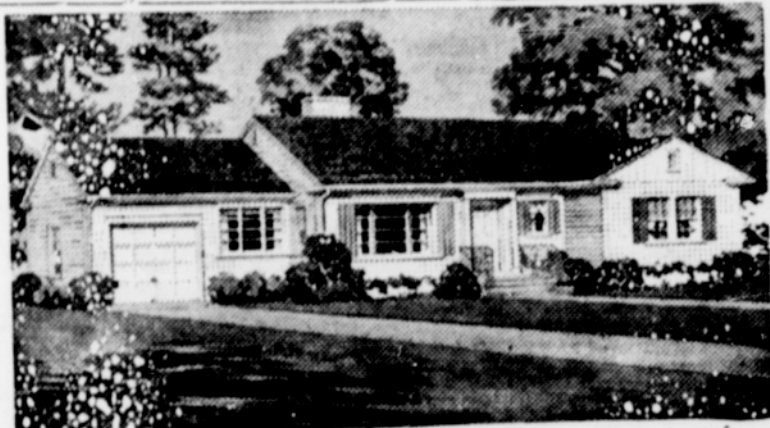
Mrs. Myrtle Bobbos has gone to Sacramento where she will stay indefinitely due to her recent illness.

Mr. and Mrs. Tom Bell have moved to Ashland where they will have medical attention.

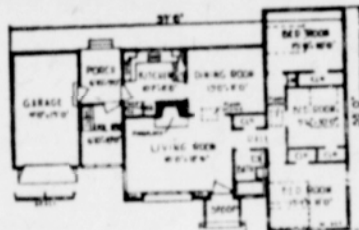

- Clean fuel pump sediment bowl and strainer.
- Blow out gas lines.
- Road Test car.
- Clean, reset and test spark plugs.

Delbert Goddard Jr. who has been quite ill with flu is up and around again.

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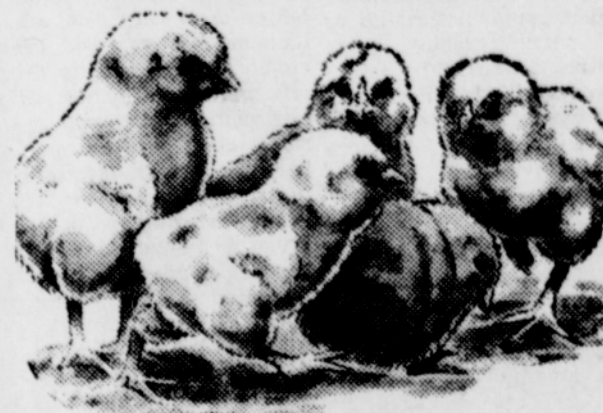
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
