**Valuable Documents And Articles Contained In Old Corner Stone**

There has been much interest and discussion following the publication of the 1879 history of Ashland found in the opening of the Masonic temple cornerstone, and many people have asked for further data on the contents of the box, therefore the list which is printed below will be a source of historical information.

In a copper box about 1 foot square were the following articles and documents:  
A bottle of grape wine (half seeped out) the first ever made in Ashland, presented by Jasper Houch and O. Coolidge.  
A glass of jelly (evaporated, corroded lid) by Mrs. J. M. McCall.

Samples of woolsens sold by Ashland Woolen Mills Manufacturing Co., (W. H. Atkinson, E. K. Anderson, James Thornton, Jacob Wagner) "cassimeres, overwear and underwear."

A history of the founding and settlement of Ashland, written by W. H. Leeds.

Small bottle essence of Jamaica ginger manufactured by Dr. J. H. Chitwood, druggist.

Pair of buckskin gloves made by John Hutchings Glove factory which was at that time located about a half mile up on what is now Granite, employed 12 women.

A dental magazine put in by "old Doc" W. Jackson of Jacksonville.

Piece of stalactite rock from Mammoth Cave, Ky.

List of Ashland city officers 1879: H. C. Hill, chairman; H. T. Inlow, Silas Kilgore, A. V. Gillette, and E. Walrad, marshal.

Small horse-shoe, deposited by Samuel Morgan, blacksmith.

Pamphlet on the prize Percheron horses and Jersey cattle bred by W. C. Meyer (Meyer came to Oregon in 1853, lived where Ralph Billings now lives.) Gold specimen deposited by H. C. Tolman.

Specimens of locally grown grains and seeds, E. K. Anderson.

Specimen of acacia blossom. Barnes History of the United States, published 1872.

Catalogue and price list of fire-arms and fishing tackle. Completely obliterated tin-

type.  
An address by Professor L. I. Rogers, president of the Normal, on the occasion of the laying of the cornerstone of the Presbyterian church.

Piece of lava rock picked up in 1869 by David Linn on the island in the center of Crater Lake. He was one of the first white men to make the landing on the island.

Sample card of "imperishable" paint.

Folder of the normal school and college, (was on site of what is now the Briscoe school). The president was Rev. L. L. Rogers, listed as "Professor of Mental

and Mora! Sciences." Mrs. Rogers was the "Preceptress."  
Copy of the Ashland Tidings. The advertising columns were most interesting, especially the schedule for the Linkville (Klamath Falls) Ashland stages which made the trip between the two towns "the same day."
