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Moose or Elk?

"I wish, sometimes, that big game hunters would study up on their game identification before they take to the woods."

These were the sentiments of Gene Sherman, district warden supervisor from Bozeman, in a report to the Montana fish and game department.

With the annual elk hunt in full swing, anything that walks near Gardiner seems to be fair game, Sherman lamented. Besides several hunting casualties among the nimrods themselves, 26 moose have been mistakenly shot for elk.

Of this number, eleven were discovered in time to salvage the meat, after having been left by the near-sighted sportsmen. The remainder of the 26 were in such a state that the meat was not to be saved.

Sherman concluded that the illegal slaughter of moose in that area is the result of hunters not being sure of their targets before the squeeze of the fatal shots.

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Barometer Effect

Since barometric pressure is a result of weather, it is logical that its effect on fishing should be considered. Generally speaking, fish like the same kind of weather humans do, and when you get a clear day, with a light breeze ruffling the water and it seems "just made for fishing," the odds are 100 to 1 that that is true—and fishing then may be the best you've ever had. On these days the barometer is "rising."

Saws Used in Home

The saws commonly used in the home are the hacksaw and the handsaw. The hacksaw is used to cut metal and the handsaw to cut wood. There are two types of handsaws, the rip saw to cut with the grain and the crosscut to saw across the grain. All saws should be kept sharp. In starting a saw cut, the thumb of the left hand should be used to guide the blade until the cut is started at the desired location. The first stroke of the saw should be in the up direction. Sufficient pressure should be used when starting the cut so that the saw immediately begins to bite into the wood.

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Safflower Acreage

Safflower is on the move at last. In the doldrums of experimentation for two full decades after its first importation from Russia and India, safflower, or false saffron, covered no more than 2,000 acres in America's northern great plains by 1946.

Then, earning new support as a commercial crop, the spiny-leaved plant spread to 40,000 acres by 1949. Current government estimates indicate the 1950 safflower acreage will be almost four times greater than last year. Furfural, used in the plastics industry, can be made from the hulls. Paper, cardboard, and plastic products can be made from safflower stalks.

Fall Hog Pasture

Frequently more difficulty is experienced in caring for fall pigs than for spring pigs. One reason is that the sows and pigs are confined more than in the spring because pastures are not available. Therefore, in making plans for fall farrowing the pastures should be given attention. A combination of permanent and temporary pasture may be worked out to give considerable green feed during some of the winter months.

Origin of "Tank"

The military tank which has become a major factor in the Korean fighting was developed by the British in World War I. The British, in order to keep the real purpose of the machine a secret, gave out the story that the huge machines were "tanks" for carrying water. The name caught on and was never changed.

Bubonic Plague

The "Black Death" devastated Europe in the fourteenth century, wiped out over a third of the total population. Time and time again the terror struck, the attacks continuing until the eighteenth century. When in 1720 it re-entered Marseilles to claim 40,000 victims, it had already left hundreds of thousands dead in its path, including 70,000 in the London of 1665.
