New Blood Test Found To Detect Diseases

Doctors in the near future may have a new blood test that will detect the presence of various diseases and also measure the effectiveness of different methods of medical treatment.

The basis for the new blood test, known as the "universal reaction," comes from 25 years of continuous effort by Dr. Reuben L. Kahn, developer of the "Kahn test" and chief of the serology laboratory at the University of Michigan.

The following is a simplified explanation of how Dr. Kahn's "universal reaction" works: 1) In a normal, healthy individual, there is daily tissue wear and tear resulting in the death of certain body tissue cells; 2) when the cells are thus destroyed, they break up and release their contents into body fluids, including the blood stream; 3) certain fat-like substances called "lipids" are part of the released cell contents; 4) some of the "lipids" become foreign to the body tissues and call forth the production of antibodies, presumably to neutralize or destroy the lipids; and 5) presence of these antibodies is measured by the "universal reaction."

Motorists Direct Cops

Motorists direct the traffic cops in Belgrade and other cities of Yugoslavia. Approaching a traffic officer on duty, they signal their intentions by horn—one toot to continue straight, two for a right turn, three for a left. Instantly the policeman wheels and points the way with a white-gloved flourish. Not recommended for New York or Chicago, the method works in Belgrade because motorists are so few.

Russian Railroads

Russian railroads have managed to set the world's record for railroad accidents. In 1934, Lazar Kaganovich, then Commissar of Transportation, reversed these startling figures: 62,000 accidents occurred on the Russian railway system that year. Hundreds of lives were lost and thousands were injured, but Comrade Kaganovich passed over these matters lightly in his report. What worried him was the loss of 7,000 locomotives and 64,000 cars destroyed. Only 19,000 new cars were placed in service during the same year, Comrade K. wailed.

Origin of Agony

It is strange that a word which denotes anguish and intolerable pain should have its origin in a festive sport event; yet this is the case with agony. In ancient Greece, agony was an assembly at games and athletic contests. Agonia was the contest or struggle for the prize. From the meaning "a struggle for victory in the games," agony gradually broadened to mean any physical struggle, an activity fraught with difficulty or pain, and then mental anguish as well. Our own word agony, borrowed from this source, meant struggle or anguish of mind, then the throes of death, and hence any extreme bodily pain.

Old Story

The jingle, "Mother, May I Go Out to Swim," is fourteen-hundred years old and comes from a jest book of the sixteenth century. A favorite of children in the nurseries of medieval castles, it continues to be popular among English-speaking peoples. For every man of the present time who knows the classic Beowulf, there are at least five-hundred who know the jingle.

Uranium Alchemy

There are two main centers of the United States where uranium ore is turned by modern alchemy into fissionable "heavy atoms". At Oak Ridge, Tenn., natural uranium is converted into gas and driven through porous baffles to separate U-235, the isotope useful for the atomic bomb. At Hanford, Wash., huge nuclear reactors turn uranium into plutonium, an unstable element which does not occur on earth naturally.

Erratic Sun

Why doesn't the Sun rise and set in the same direction all the year around? The axis on which the Earth rotates every day is not at right angles to the plane in which it revolves about the Sun, but tilted about 23.5 degrees. Between March and September the northern hemisphere leans towards the Sun, so we see it far north in the sky. It rises in the northeast and sets in the northwest. Around December, however, the northern hemisphere leans away from the Sun, which is then seen far to the south, so it rises in the southeast and sets in the southwest. At the equinoxes, about March 21 and Sept. 23, the Sun is directly over the Earth's equator, and neither north nor south, so it rises due east and sets directly west.
