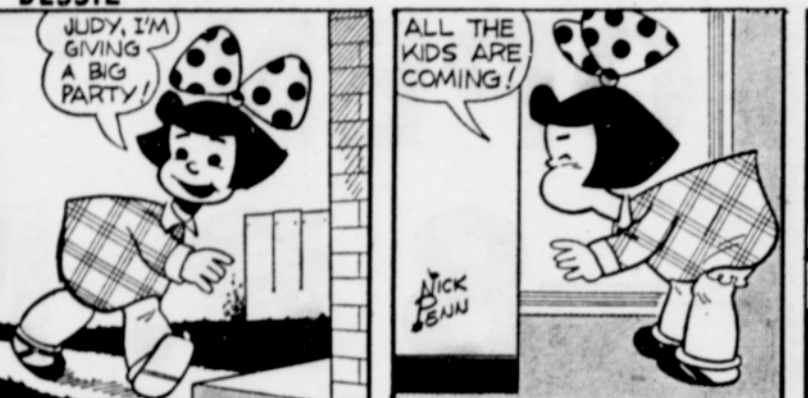

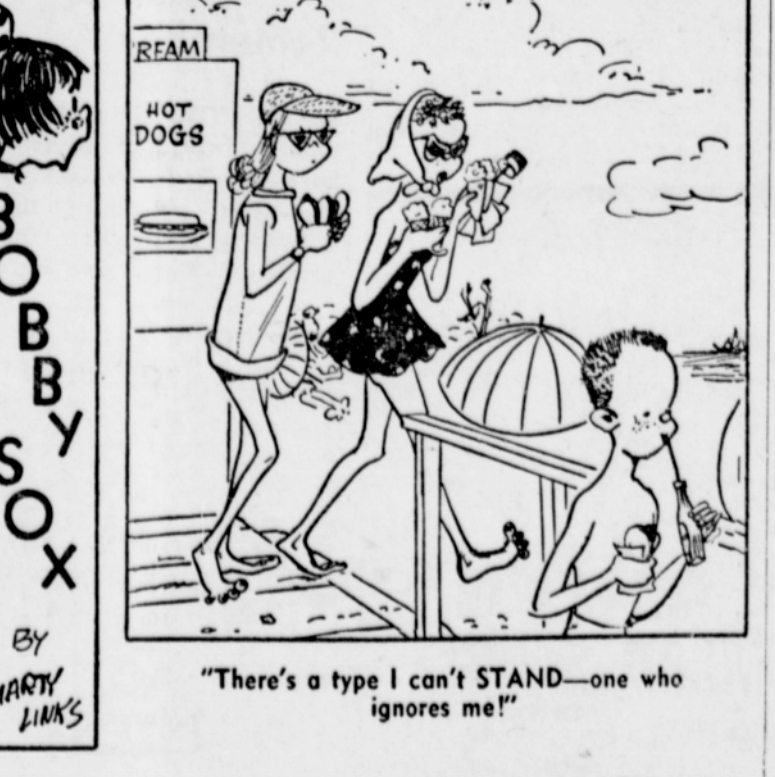

Mongoloid Tribes Beat Columbus To America
