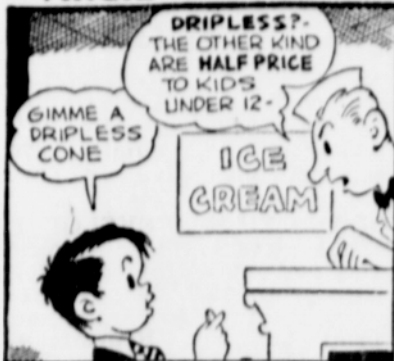

French Forest Assumes Entirely New 'Shape'

The ghosts of Bourbon monarchs and musketeers will rein up their mounts this spring before an odd sign in a forest near Paris. The signpost will read SHAPE—Supreme Headquarters, Allied Powers in Europe.

Behind the sign, on a 60-acre tract a few miles from Versailles, sprawling barracks and an office building with 18 wings will grow like spring wildflowers into General Eisenhower's European "Pentagon."

As a permanent site for SHAPE, the French government has set aside an unused portion of a presidential shooting preserve in the famous Forest of Marly. Here, backed by rolling saucer-rim ridges where kings and courtiers once rode to the hunting horn, the problems of Europe's defense in the 1950's will be hammered out.

## Tiger Still A Terror

Not by legend alone has the great cat of Asia been feared and respected. In the jungles of India and mountains of Mongolia, across Burma, Indochina, Malaya, Sumatra and Java, the tiger still kills men. Bushman, Famous Gorilla, Dies at Chicago Zoo

CHICAGO, Ill. — Bushman, the most famous gorilla in the world, died recently at Lincoln park zoo in Chicago. He had been the single biggest attraction at any Chicago zoo for the last 20 years.

He came to the zoo when he was two and weighed 38 pounds. He had been captured in French Cameroon country of West Africa. The zoo paid \$3,500 for him.

Zoo officials said the big animal was a showman, that he liked crowds and they seemed to stimulate him. He weighed 550 pounds and was six feet, two inches tall when he died.

Some three million persons a year went to see Bushman. He was as widely known—some would say better known—in Chicago than the mayor or any other citizen.

Zoo veterinarians said the great ape died of a heart attack.

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Pockmarks on Moon

Rice is the most important food in the world.

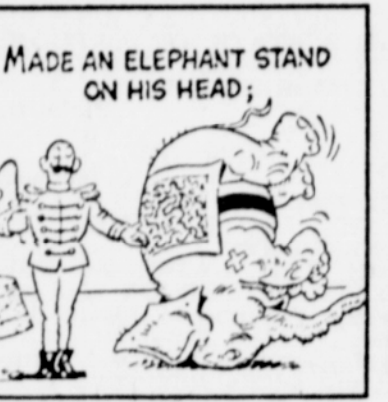
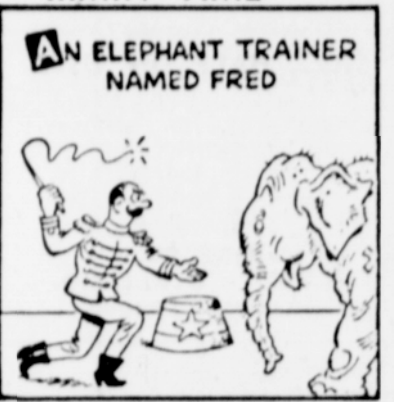
