GRIZZLIES WIN FIRST GAME

The Ashland Grizzlies, who scored a 41-26 triumph over Coquille in their opening action of the season, will journey to Crescent City for their second test Saturday night.

The Grizzlies, playing under their new coach, Charlie Jandreau, for the first time, set up a tight defense against the Red Devils and gave indications of considerable offensive power in the initial start last Friday.

Jandreau substituted freely during the contest in an effort to better gain an idea of the comparative strength of his players.

Lining Impressive

The Ashland mentor was particularly pleased with the performance of Gregg Lining — the six-foot, five-inch junior up from jayvee ranks. Lining looked good defensively and scored two field goals and a free throw during his abbreviated performance.

Topping the Grizzly scorers was Merle Deets, who was out of basketball action last year because of a knee injury. Deets had four field goals and four free throws for a 12-point total.

Bill Hollingsworth, who has taken over the first string center post held by Dick Smith last year, hit four field goals before going out of the game on five personal fouls.

SURPRISING RAIDERS BEAT OTI

Southern Oregon college's surprising Red Raiders will journey to Monmouth Friday for a two-game series with their arch rivals — the Oregon College of Education Wolves.

Coach Ted Schopf of SOC, in pre-season statements, marked 1951-52 as a building year. But last Friday and Saturday, the team for the future gave every indication of being ready now when they scuttled the highly-touted Oregon Technical Institute Wolves, 65-53 and 65-50.

'Smooth' Outfit

Pleasantly startled Red Raider fans saw as smooth an outfit as Schopf has produced. It was an outfit that didn't read the press notices about the amazing Owls and their initial 99-12 and 80-8 triumphs.

In Friday's game, the Southern Oregon crew stepped right out into the lead on a free throw by Bill McLean and a field goal by Ken Kimura and were never headed. They led 20-15 at the end of the first quarter, 35-27 at the half and had the game on ice, 59-31 after a sizzling hot third canto.

Ditto, Saturday

Saturday, the Owls started like they meant to make things tough for Schopf's game. Three times, the visitors from Klamath Falls grabbed the lead in opening minutes. But when Kimura bagged a field goal and put the Red Raiders ahead, 9-7 at the seven-minute mark, the show was over for OTI. SOC held a tight 14-10 edge at the first quarter, a 33-25 halftime edge and 44-39 at the end of the third quarter. The burst of scoring for the Red Raiders was saved for the fourth quarter.

Dairy Group
Lists Top Herds

The five top dairy herds of the Jackson County Dairy Herd Improvement association have been announced for November.

They belong to R. L. Wyant whose herd of 21 cows (one dry) averaged 800 pounds of milk and 48.4 pounds of butterfat; W. D. Mongold, 21 cows (five dry), 736 pounds of milk, 43.8 pounds of butterfat; Phelan Nelson, 14 cows, 832 pounds milk, 41.3 pounds of butterfat; Herman Higday, 26 cows (two dry), 1007 pounds milk, 40.7 pounds of butterfat; and Rollins and Son, 23 cows, 603 pounds milk and 34.6 pounds of butterfat.

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SINCE 1925

AGRICULTURAL GROWTH NOTED

Rate of growth in Oregon's agricultural since 1925 has been about 3½ per cent a year, Oregon State college agricultural economists point out in a new extension bulletin, No. 722, entitled, "Oregon's Long - term Trends in Agriculture," which is now ready for distribution.

The bulletin says cash receipts from farm marketings increased from approximately 134 million dollars during the 1925-29 period to an average 375 million for 1945-49. This is a gain of 180 per cent in current dollars, partly owing to prices that increased 65 per cent.

Cash Decrease Noted

A quarter century ago, the bulletin points out, livestock and livestock products accounted for more than half of Oregon's cash receipts from farm marketings. Latest figure shows this total is now about 44 per cent. While some livestock, especially sheep and hogs, have been decreasing, new types of seed crops, processing vegetables and specialty products have become increasingly important.

While value of farm products has been climbing, land used for farm crops has increased only about 10 per cent during the past 30 years. The total now stands at approximately 4,600,000 acres.

All groups of crops except hay and tree fruits and nuts, have increased over the past three decades, according to the bulletin.

Seed Crops Grow

Over the years forage seed crops have shown an outstanding growth. In 1949, this group of crops accounted for nearly 8 per cent of the cropland harvest, compared with less than one per cent in 1919. Milk cows on January 1, 1951, at 235,000 were nearly a fifth below the wartime peak in 1943 and the lowest since 1930. On the other hand, beef cows have been on a

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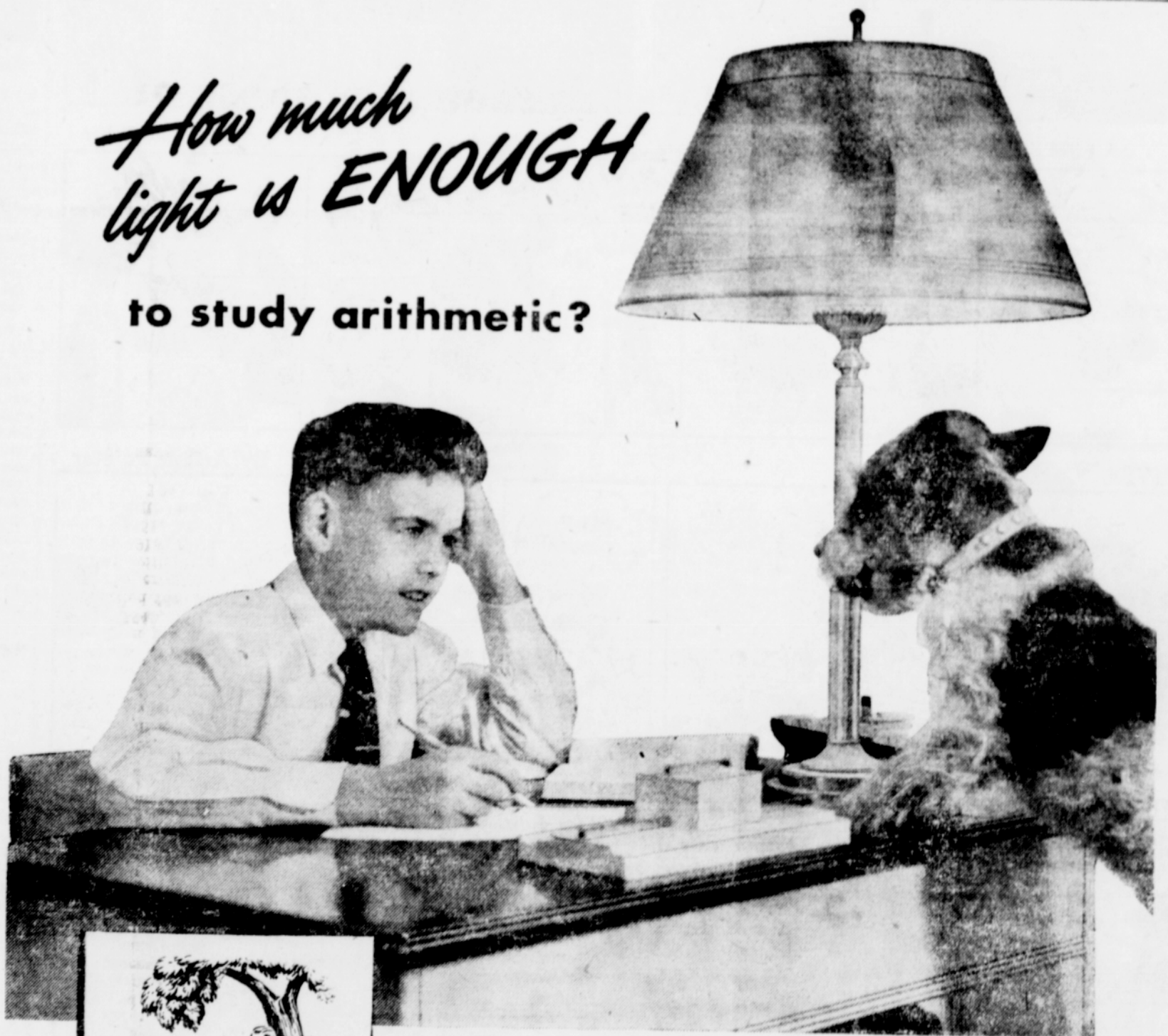
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
