Even more to Graham's credit than this is the almost impossible task given him in the flashbacks, but a task which he was somehow up to.

The entire focus of the play is on Willie Loman and flashes of the past are seen through his eyes. In the flashbacks, then, those characters in the play who also appear in the present can shuck their age and play themselves as younger people, but not the lead. He must play a Willie Loman of 45 without letting the audience forget that he is Willie Loman at 60.

This complete absorption with the role of Willie Loman, while it gives the play unity and makes the idea, tends to make one forget what an excellent job the lead's supporting cast did in the show. Again, it is difficult to point to one actor or actress and say his or her job was above the rest.

Someone remarked, after a performance last week, that he forgot that Angus Bowmer was Angus, in his quiet, sensitive portrayal of Willie's friend, Charlie. That struck the reviewer as an outstanding tribute to an actor whom local audiences know so well.

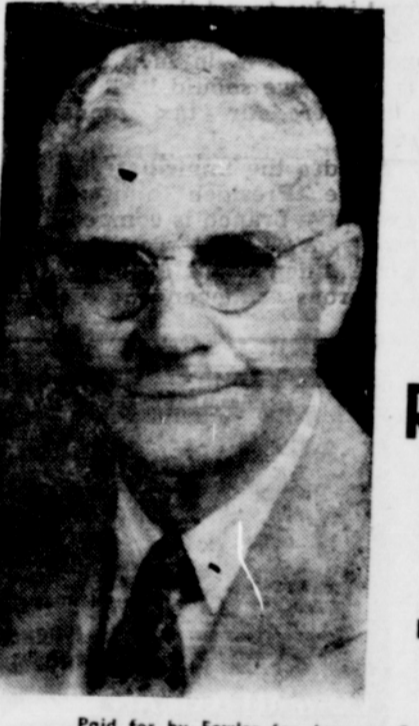
