"Baseball's Magna Carta"

Through Oct 9, 10am-5pm (Mon-Sat), noon-5pm (Sun), Oregon Historical Society Museum (1200 SW Park Ave, Portland). View "Baseball's Magna Carta," a display of the first written rules of baseball — handwritten documents that were drafted by Daniel "Doc" Adams for presentation to an unprecedented special meeting of all New York area baseball clubs in 1857. The recent discovery of the documents has changed the perception of the early history of baseball by naming Adams the proper father of the modern game, and not the often mis-credited Abner Doubleday.
