"Talking Pictures"

Most importantly, the dialogue is focused on the creation of new life at such a precarious time, as the artists, both pregnant during this project, conclude the 122-image conversation with the arrival of their newborns. In his own time (701-762), Li Bai's poems shaped by Daoist thought and characterized by their passion, romance, and lust for life — were never given their proper due by official literary gatekeepers. Nonetheless, his lines rang out on the lips of court entertainers, tavern singers, soldiers, and writers throughout the Tang dynasty, and his deep desire for a higher, more perfect world gave rise to his nickname, the Banished Immortal. Today, Bai's verses are still taught to China's schoolchildren and recited at parties and toasts, and they remain an inextricable part of the Chinese language.
