Division of Financial Regulation - What we do

The Division of Financial Regulation of the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services is the state agency that regulates insurance companies and insurance agents and agencies.

Consumer advocacy: Consumers with insurance complaints or questions may contact the division's Consumer Advocacy Unit at 1-888-877-4894 (toll-free in Oregon).

Insurance company regulation: The Division of Financial Regulation licenses and monitors insurance companies doing business in Oregon to ensure they meet their financial obligations and comply with state laws and rules governing fair treatment of policyholders.

Insurance agent regulation: The division licenses insurance agents, who must meet initial license requirements and complete continuing education classes to renew their licenses.
