## World's oldest man, who said his secret was smiling, dies at 112

■OKYO — A Japanese man who received his certificate as the world's oldest man with a raised fist and big smiles in early February has died at age 112.

Guinness World Records had given the certificate to Chitetsu Watanabe on February 12. The organization and the funeral home handling his services confirmed he died on Sunday, February 23. No cause was given.

He had not been able to eat recently and developed a fever and difficulty breathing a couple of days before his death, Japan's nationally circulated newspaper Mainichi reported, citing family sources.

Watanabe is survived by his five

confirmed on the northern island of Hokkaido.

Abe's announcement came hours after several local governments announced their own decisions to suspend classes for shorter periods.

Officials in Hokkaido said they were closing all 1,600 elementary and middle schools. Hokkaido now has at least 54 confirmed cases, the largest in the country outside the cruise ship.

Some local governments quickly said they will abide by the request, but others criticized the short notice and said it would affect working parents who need to find sitters for young school children.

"Society will fall apart because of the measures," said Chiba mayor Toshihito Kumagai, adding that he will come up with

children, 12 grandchildren, 16 greatgrandchildren, and one great-greatgrandchild, Mainichi said.

Watanabe's family did not immediately answer calls to their home.

Watanabe was born in 1907 and worked in Taiwan for 18 years. After returning to Niigata, northern Japan, he worked for the prefectural government until retirement.

He grew fruit and vegetables on the family farm and loved cream puffs and bonsai, the Japanese traditional art of raising small sculpted trees.

He used to say the secret to longevity was to keep smiling.

Guinness in Japan offered its condolences to his family.

The oldest living person is also Japanese, Kane Tanaka, a 117-year-old woman.

Japan's school year ends in March, leaving little time for final exams or graduation ceremonies.

Schools should keep exams and graduation ceremonies to a minimum and take all necessary precautions, Abe said.

"Our graduation ceremony is coming up soon, and it's quite a hectic time of the year," Norinobu Sawada, vice principal of Koizumi Elementary School in Hokkaido's Kitami City, told TBS television. "The most important thing is to prevent infections, so there aren't many other options."

The Japanese government has also asked companies to allow employees to work flexible hours or work from home to reduce infection risks.
