1899 TAX ROLL.

THE AMOUNT DELINQUENT.

Following is the report of W. W. Withers, Sheriff and Tax Collector of Lane county, on the tax roll of 1899, showing the original roll, collections, corrections and amount delinquent, August 15, 1500, at which time the rolls were closed for the purpose of extending the delinquent roll
