Death of Prof. McElroy.

Prof E. B. McElroy died suddenly, of heart disease, at his home in Eugene, Friday night, about 11:30 o'clock.

Deceased was a member of the Christian Church and held membership in the Masons, Elks, A. O. U. W. and G. A. Rose, of the Christian Church. Remains were interred in the I. O. O. F. cemetary at Corvallis.
