THE NEW LAW.

Sheriff Withers advertises: "Monday, July 8, 1901, all lands upon which Lane county holds tax sale certificates of more than two years standing will be offered for sale at auction."

Lebanon Express-Advance: Elsewhere in this issue is the announcement of a sheriff's sale of all property bid in by the county at tax sales. . . . The new law provides that owners of such property may redeem same before July 1st by paying the amount of taxes and costs. After that time a penalty of 30 per cent on the amount of tax and costs is added. Notwithstanding any indefinite or imperfect description of such land on the assessment roll, or other defects, specified in the law pertaining to the original sale, the purchaser from the county at the July sale acquires a good title. If, therefore, any owners of property heretofore purchased by the county at tax sales, are relying on such defects to hold their real estate, it would be well for them to inspect the new law by the 1st of July.
