She stood the ocean voyage remark-

 York by her son, whom she instantly
 recognized in a crowd.

She says that she was 6 years old
 at the death of George III. She dis-
 tinctly remembers the accession of
 George IV. to the throne. She was 17
 when the Duke of Clarence, Wil-
 liam IV., took the throne of England.
 When Victoria acquired the title of
 Queen of Great Britain and Ireland,
 Mrs. Davies was 24. Edward VII.,
 who was reigning when she left, made
 the fifth sovereign under whom she
 lived.

Tombs Six Thousand Years Old.
 The village of Flamborn, near May-
 ence, in the Hessian Palatinate, has
 just become the center of much archae-
 ological interest, writes a Berlin
 correspondent. Some excavators have
 discovered an ancient cemetery where
 the dead were buried in a sitting pos-
 ition. In some of the tombs stone axes
 were found at a depth of about fifty
 centimeters under the surface. Archae-
 ologists assume that the tombs date
 back to a period of about 6,000 years
 ago. Adjacent to this cemetery an-
 other was found containing Frankish
 tombs, dating from the age of Charle-
 magne. The first discovery does away
 with the theory that the Rhine in pre-
 historic times, before it broke through
 at Bingen on its way to the ocean, ex-
 isted as an enormous inland sea, cov-
 ering the country now known as the
 Palatinate. Prof. Virchow and other
 eminent scientists have been to see the
 extraordinary discoveries.
