CROP REPORT.

The United States weather bureau reports the conditions of crops in Oregon, which in part, says:

Droughty conditions continue in portions of Southern Oregon. The temperatures have averaged about 6 deg. cooler than usual, and cloudiness has also been somewhat greater than is customary at this season of the year. The maximum temperatures during the week in Western Oregon ranged between 59 deg. and 76 deg., and the minimum temperatures between 40 deg. and

Having has been delayed by showery and cloudy weather, and some clover lying on the ground has been injured. but most of that cut has been safely housed. A big crop of timothy hav is now ready to cut, but the farmers are waiting for warmer sunshiny weather before beginning its harvest. The first crop of alfalfa has been secured and the yields averaged about the same as last year. 'Fall grain is ripening fast, and the harvest of barley and rve will begin next week. Fall wheat in the Willamette valley is generally in a promising condition. The grain aphis has made its appearance in considerable numbers in Clackamas, Marion, Polk and Yamhill counties, but they do not seem to he doing much damage. Spring wheat is heading nicely and fall oats are especially promising. In Eastern Oregon wheat is generally doing well, but the winds have been rather too strong in Umatilia county, and although they have been drying winds, and it is feared some slight damage has been done.


