"High Jinks" will be the attraction at the Eugene Theatre for Tuesday evening March 2. The piece, which was produced under the personal direction of Arthur Hammerstein, is described as a musical jollity, with books and lyrics by Otto Hauerbach and Rudolph Friml, authors of "The Firefly" and "Naughty Marietta."

"High Jinks" ran for the entire year at the Casino Theatre, New York. The music is said to be far above the American standard and fully half a dozen of the production's songs have been whistled, hummed and sung here for many months. The cast which will present "High Jinks" is said to be practically the same as that which was seen at the Casino. The charges are minor ones. The leading part is assumed by Stella Mayhew, who is well known to local theatre-goers. She is assisted by Eugene O'Rourke, Billie Taylor, Phillip Ryley, Emma Francis, Adele Ardsley, Paul Porcasi, Irene Duke, Ada Meade, Bernard Gorcey, Cecilia Hoffman, Dorothy Wade, Dot Allen, Augustus Schulz.

"High Jinks" has a dozen or more tuneful numbers. The main theme of the music is contained in the song, "Something Seems Tingle-Ingling," the melody which is interwoven into the score in various ways, and whose refrain is expressive of the effect of nearly all the numbers. Beginning with last Monday Mr. Kirk has been in his office at 8:30 in the morning. The stenographers in turn have a morning a week when they take let-

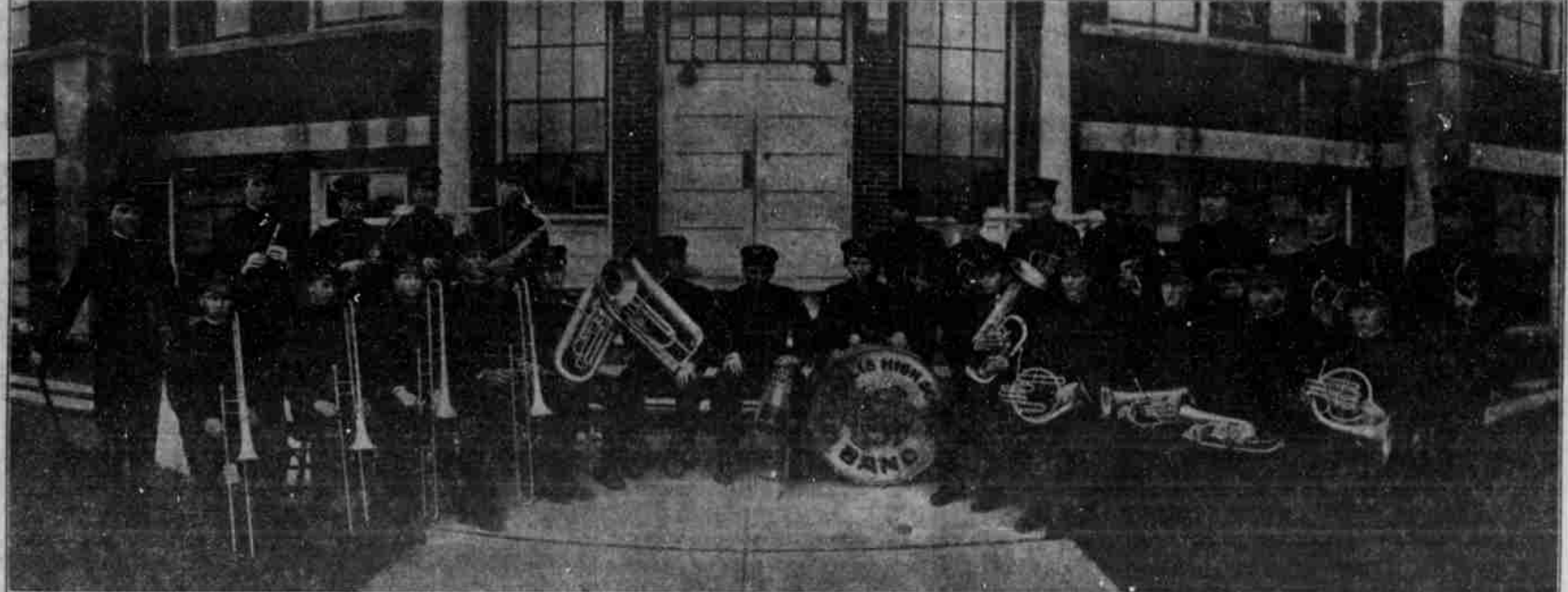
hand them back to Mr. Kirk the same day in written form.
