Believe That Federal Government Can Take Care of Situation Without Other Commissions

If the railroads of the United States are to be regulated interests of the public the nature of the situation dictates that such regulation shall be exclusively by the federal government.

To continue the present policy of co-ordinate regulation by the federal government and by forty-eight states, with diverging and conflicting interests and ideas often purely local in character but general in harmful effect, is to construct uniform improvement and prevent efficient and economic development of railway and transportation service as a whole.

A chain is no stronger than the weakest link, and, so far as interstate commerce and national efficiency of the railroads as a unit are improved, developed and adjusted to the general needs of the public along the line of a well conceived general plan, economic and efficient service can hardly be expected.
