HUGHES LEADS IN LANE COUNTY VOTE FOR THE PRESIDENT

Democrat Elect Sheriff, Coroner, and District Attorney; Most Measures Carry

Returns from 87 out of the 96 Lane county precincts give Hughes a lead of 1,394. The total from these counties stands: Hughes 6633; Wilson, 5239.

The county gave Hawley, Republican-Progressive, a majority of 1629 over Mark V. Weatherford Democratic-Prohibition. For secretary of state, Ben W. Olcott, Republican-Democratic-Progressive is the choice with a vote of 9512.

The two winners for justice of the supreme court according to Lane county's vote, are George H. Burnett, and Frank A. Moore, both Republican. John D. Mickie is the county's choice for dairy and food commissioner as is Fred G. Buchtel for public service commissioner.

For judges of the second judicial district, Lane county would elect John S. Coke, E. O. Potter, and G. F. Skipworth. As representatives of the third district, L. E. Bean, Allen Eaton, and Walter B. Jones are given preference over James Calvert, Alta King, and Joseph E. Tuttle.

Leon L. Ray, democratic nominee is the choice for district attorney by a vote of 6193 to 5295 over J. M. Devers, Republican-Progressive candidate. D. P. Burton, Republican-Progressive, is the choice for county assessor. Stacy M. Russell is returned as county clerk.

For county sheriff, James C. Parker, is given quite a lead over Charles P. Barnard.

There is no race at all between S. W. Taylor and Free Thomas for County Treasurer. Hollis W. Libby is re-elected as County Surveyor by about 3000 majority.

In the race for County Commissioner R. Y. Porter is defeated by E. R. Spencer by at least 2500 votes.

The Coronership is not definitely decided. At present Marion Veatch Democrat is leading W. W. Branster, Republican, by nearly 300 votes.

The returns show Lane county's stand on the amendments as follows: Favor Single Item Veto, Ship Tax Exemption, Compulsory Vaccination, Sunday Closing, Bone Dry Bill, Rural Credits, and Tax Limitation. The voters are opposed to Negro Suffrage, Single Tax, Pendleton Normal, Brewers' Bill.
