Blight May Yet Be Prevented

Orchard owners of Western Oregon have an unusual opportunity to make up for the failure to spray early, and still may get ahead of the rains, which are responsible for the infection periods. Spray at once for apple-tree anthracnose and for peach blight. Use Bordeaux 4-5-50, or lime-sulfur 1-8, and cover every particle of bark and every bud. Effective results cannot usually be obtained so late in the season, but due to the lateness of rains this year much good can be accomplished yet if the work is done at once.

"Morals Depend on Food"

That the health and morals of a people depend upon the kinds of food they eat, is made the basis of a new Oregon Agricultural College Bulletin, "Food for the family," copies of which may be had on request. It points out the five great classes of foods—protein, carbohydrates, fats, water, and minerals—naming the most

acceptable sources of each. Plans for meals and suggestive means are for other practical features.
