Thirty additional days of spring planting may mean for the Pacific Northwest the difference between a discouraging agingly large one. The situation is growing more satisfactory every day. The wheat prospects for the whole country this spring are decidly small. A survey made by the Federal government indicates that the United States would have very little if any more than enough for her own needs. The allies are depending on us for their food supply and a crop shortage would mean an international disaster.

The lateness of the spring will enable many farmers to reseed or to sow additional acres Mch. 26; April 2.9.16,23,30; May 7, to grain. Many districts are reseeding to insure a full crop.
