James Inman Predicts the Peace of All Nations By Inter-marriage of the Peoples.

Springfield, Ore., July 5, 1917.
To the Editor of the Springfield News.

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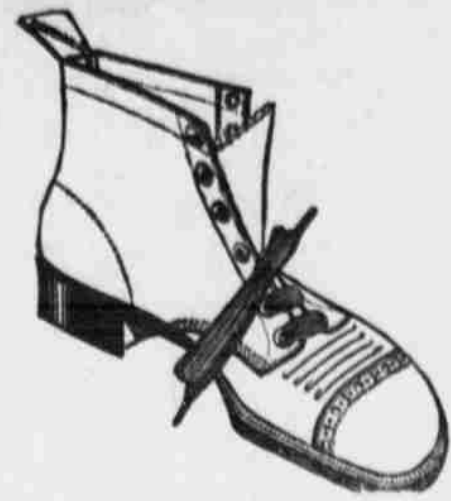
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
