LUMBERING HAS GOOD OUTLOOK

According to one reputable authority the nation is 46 per cent underbuilt.

The same authority believes that the prices of materials will rule at present levels for 1919.

It also estimates total construction for 1919 at 40 to 60 per cent of normal with lumber as cheapest building material.

Our country is liable to lose six million alien laborers of whom 1,500,000 have gone or are going this year.

This kind of labor is leaving New York at the rate of 1000 a week, and the supply of labor for industries is scarce.

Lumber yards in New York and many eastern cities have less than one-third of a normal supply, and demand is increasing.

Of a hundred brick yards in a famous eastern clay products district, more than 70 are idle for lack of labor.

Indications are that scarcity of buildings will continue through 1920 and that the demand for lumber will continue to increase.

SAVE THE SMALL FRUIT INDUSTRY

Shall the western fruit juice business be legislated out of business through the imposition of unjust taxes?

The growing industry now promising to become one of the most important factors in the horticultural development of the west, suffers because of inequitable taxes and high freight rates assessed against users of bottles of the Pacific coast.

It would seem so, unless prompt and radical action is taken on behalf of these allied industries by the people of this state and their representatives in Washington.

Manufacturers of Loganberry juice and other products are asking assistance of fruit growers and manufacturers of juices.

The tax should be eliminated. If it is, the industry may thrive.

Hundreds of thousands of dollars have been spent on building up the business and this great investment will be in jeopardy unless some relief is afforded.
