GRAHAM RAISIN BREAD

If the family is tiring of white bread try this simple and delicious recipe for brown bread, which is easily made:

Sift together 1 cup of white flour, 1-4 cup of sugar, 1-2 teaspoon of soda, 1-2 teaspoons of baking powder and 1-4 teaspoon of salt. Add 1-2 cups of Graham flour and 1 cup of seedless raisins. Mix 1 cup of sour milk with 1-3 cup of molasses and stir into the dry ingredients. Bake in a greased loaf pan 45 minutes. This is an excellent bread to serve with Baked Beans.

TOMATO BISQUE

If a hot soup is desired to be quickly served the following is one which can be made in a very few minutes.

Prepare 2 cups of thin, well-seasoned cream sauce. Heat 1 can can of Tomato Sauce, add a pinch of soda—1-16 teaspoon—and pour it into the hot cream sauce, stirring constantly. Serve at once with crisp crackers.

OYSTERS VENETIA

Heat 1 quart of oysters to the boiling point in their own liquor. Remove the oysters and keep in a hot place.

Melt 3 tablespoons of fat, add 4 tablespoons of flour, 1-4 teaspoon each of salt and pepper, and the liquid from the oysters with milk enough to make 1-2 cups. Stir till it boils and pour onto a beaten egg and 1 teaspoon of lemon juice. Cook without boiling for 2 minutes. Spread a layer of hot chopped spinach in a serving dish and on this place the oysters. Over all pour the sauce. Garnish with strips of pimiento and serve.

This makes an excellent meat, substitute, and being served with spinach either fresh or canned, with the addition of boiled rice or potatoes is a delicious and complete meal.

SUGGESTIONS FOR THE HOUSEWIFE

Chop left-over beets and mix with one-half the same proportion of horse radish for a delicious relish to serve with fish or meat.

Any sliced cold meat may be transformed into an excellent hot dish by dipping the slices in egg and fine crumbs and browning in a little fat in the frying pan. Serve with Tomato Sauce, heated.

The centers of canned pears may be filled with chopped ginger and nuts for a quick and easy dessert.

Left-over spinach, finely chopped and added to thin well-seasoned white sauce, garnished with pieces of pimiento, makes an attractive and delicious soup.

Economize on fuel by arranging to bake your entire meal in the oven, or to cook it all on top of the stove. Further fuel economy may be practiced by cooking a steamed dessert over the boiling vegetables.

OREGON LEADS DISTRICT IN SALE OF THRIFT STAMPS

From January 1, 1919 to December 1, 1919 the United States government sold more than \$124,000,000 worth of Thrift and War Savings Stamps and Treasury Savings Certificates, according to a report made by the treasury department to the war loan organization of the Twelfth federal reserve district. Oregon, one of the states of the Twelfth district, not only led in the district, but was fifth among all states and territories of the Union in the amount of securities purchased per capita.
