BOYS' AND GIRLS' CLUBS OF LANE COUNTY EARN MUCH

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, March 17.—A profit of \$497.59 was made by boys' and girls' club members of Lane county in 1919, according to the report of the state leader recently issued. The gross earnings for the year were \$66,995, and the net profit \$33,995. While Lane county was not one of the three best as listed, H. C. Seymour, state leader of boys' and girls' clubs, considers the work of the county as a whole, good.

Home making is a new project for the girls this year and includes 10 lessons in the care of the home, laundry, furniture, bedrooms, kitchen, equipment and the final lesson is the marketing for the entire family for a week's time. Cooking clubs prepare ten dishes and serve a meal to several persons, keeping accurate record which must be filed with the state leader before the club receives credit. Other projects include pig, calf, sheep, gardening work.
