NO TAX INCREASE

No direct property tax whatever is required for the state highway bonds to be issued under the constitutional amendment to be voted upon at the election May 21, say the officers of the Oregon Roads and Development association. The measure is for increasing the state road bond limit from 2 per cent to 4 per cent of the assessed valuation of property within issue sufficient bonds to complete the main state highways.

Principal and interest for these bonds are financed entirely by the producer can afford to ignore.
