EMMETT SHARP STATES PLATFORM IN PETITION

Cottage Grove Man Files for County Commissioner.

Emmett M. Sharp of Cottage Grove has filed his nominating petition for the Republican nomination of county commissioner. Mr. Sharp says in his petition that if nominated and elected to the office he will "administer the duties honestly and fearlessly to the best of my ability; give a sound, economic business administration of county affairs generally; will endeavor to abolish the present extravagant system of supervision on road and bridge construction, thereby saving approximately \$10,000 annually. I favor a patrol system that will maintain our roads in good repair the year round, instead of the present method of expensive repairs once annually. My eight years' experience in road building as supervisor and contractor will be used to reduce the cost of road building so as to give a dollar in roads for every dollar expended." Mr. Sharp desires to have the following placed opposite his name on the ballot: "Money on roads, not in supervision. Good roads kept good."
