bonds than necessary to keep the equipment and organization active until taxes are paid the following year.

Fifth—Next year, or whenever business conditions become settled, labor more plentiful and efficiency greater, that you then proceed as fast as possible to permanently locate, properly grade, thoroughly drain and surface with macadam according to program, the roads designated and shown upon the road map of Lane county that was presented to and adopted by the people at the recent special election.

### Show Actual Cost.

Sixth—We recommend that you immediately install and keep a practical efficient cost system on all road and bridge work, whether it be maintenance or construction work. A system that will enable the court and the taxpayers to know exactly what every part of every project or section has cost or is costing the county.

The Lane County Good Roads association, its executive committee and its officers, desire to merit, hold and enjoy the confidence of the people of Lane county, and they also desire the county court to merit and enjoy this same confidence, and we appreciate that this can only be done by all of us proceeding in harmony to secure the best results possible to attain.

Our people want more and better

## MUFFINS and POPOVERS

From the NEW ROYAL COOK BOOK

BREAKFAST is too often eaten as a duty rather than a joy. The success of the day may depend upon the spirit of breakfast. The Royal Educational Department presents some breakfast dishes that will send the children to school with a hip hip hurrah and his majesty man to his daily duties with the "up and doing" feeling which knows no discouragement.

### Muffins

2 cups flour  
 3 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder  
 1 tablespoon sugar  
 ½ teaspoon salt  
 1 cup milk  
 2 eggs  
 1 tablespoon shortening  
 Sift together flour, baking powder, sugar and salt; add milk, well-beaten eggs and melted shortening; mix well. Grease muffin tins and put two tablespoons of batter into each. Bake in hot oven 20 to 25 minutes.

### Eggless Muffins

2 cups flour  
 4 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder  
 3 tablespoons sugar  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 1 cup milk  
 3 tablespoons shortening  
 Mix and sift dry ingredients, add milk and melted shorten-

ing and beat until smooth. Bake in greased muffin tins in hot oven 20 to 25 minutes.

### Corn Muffins

½ cup corn meal  
 ½ cups flour  
 4 teaspoons Royal Baking Powder  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 2 tablespoons sugar  
 1 cup milk  
 2 tablespoons shortening  
 1 egg

Sift together corn meal, flour, baking powder, salt and sugar; add milk, melted shortening and well-beaten egg; mix well. Grease muffin tins and drop two tablespoons of mixture into each. Bake about 35 minutes in hot oven.

### Popovers

2 cups flour  
 ½ teaspoon salt  
 2 eggs  
 2 cups milk

Sift together flour and salt. Make a well in flour, break eggs into well, add milk and stir until smooth. Pour into hot greased pop pans and bake 25 to 35 minutes in a very hot oven. If taken out of oven too soon they will fall.
