COMING TO LIFE
 Springfield's Chamber of Commerce seems to be coming back to life. SPRINGFIELD'S CENSUS

It is the opinion of several who are in close touch with matters of this kind and who are familiar with the school census, that there must be some mistake in the figures for 1920, giving Springfield a population of only 1855.

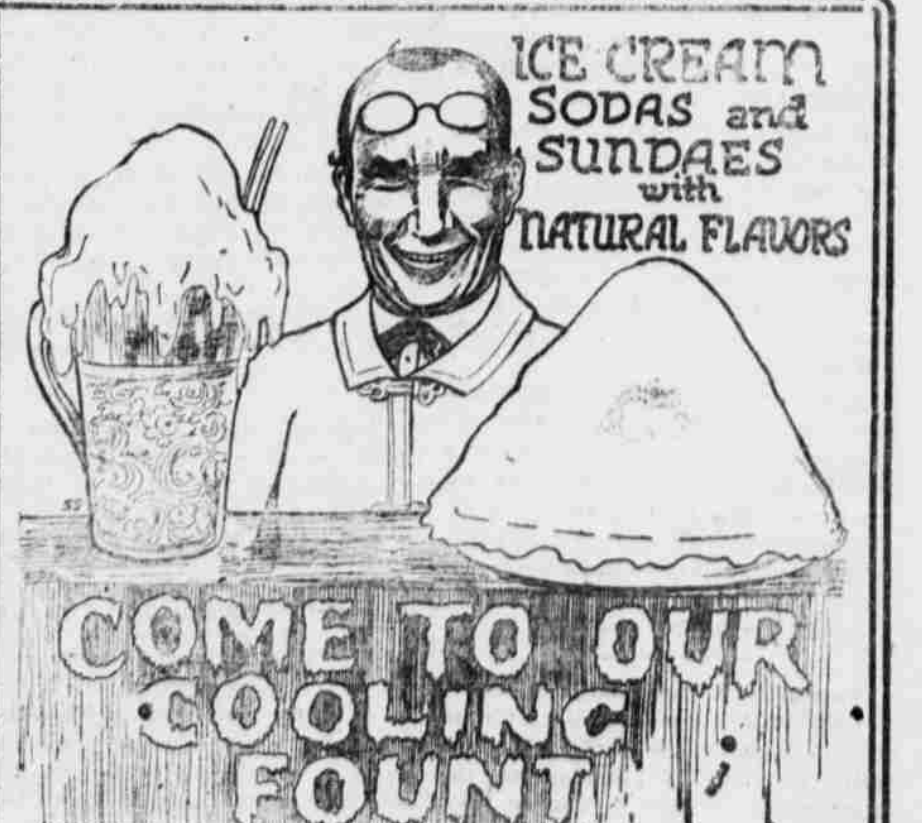
