The total assessed valuation of Lane county for this year, exclusive of public service corporations, which will be reported upon later, is \$30,-673,189, according to a report by Assessor Herbebrt E. Walker.

A growth of \$19,924 over last year is shown for Lane county this year. This does not include the valuation of automobiles which were not assessed this year. Last year the autos were assessed at a value of \$633,955. Deducting this sum from last year's assessment makes the actual increase in property value this year \$673,879 over that of last year.
