dish of the meal, and as a substitute for meat. It is also served with the meat course at dinner and will in this way extend the vegetable to serve a greater number of persons.

Tomato Souffle Spanish Style
 Ont can tomatoes, one sliced onion, one teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, three egg yolks, three stiffly beaten egg whites and one tablespoon fat.

Pour off three tablespoons of the puree from the tomatoes and reserve it. Add the sliced onion and 1/2 teaspoon of the salt to the remainder of the tomato and stew gently 10 minutes. In the meantime beat the yolks till thick, add three tablespoons of tomato puree and 1/2 teaspoon of salt and continue beating. Fold in the egg whites. Grease a hot frying pan thoroughly with the fat, pour in the egg mixture and cook till delicately browned on the bottom. Then bake in the oven till "puffy" and firm. Fold like an omelete, turn out on serving dish and serve with stewed tomatoes poured over it.

Green Pea Souffle.
 One cup canned or cooked peas, one tablespoon fat, two tablespoons flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, one small onion grated, one cup milk, three egg yolks, three stiffly beaten egg whites. Melt the fat, add flour, salt, pepper, onion, and milk and bring to boiling point, stirring. Mash the peas and add to the sauce with the well beaten yolks. Fold in the whites and pour into a greased baking dish. Bake in a slow oven till firm.

Cinnamon Tarts.
 Roll pastry into a rectangular shape and brush with melted butter. Sprinkle with a mixture of cinnamon and sugar. Cut into 1/2-inch strips and bake in a hot oven. These are delicious with afternoon tea.

Pear Tarts.
 Cover the bottom of inverted custard cups or muffin pans with pastry. Pierce with a fork and bake in a hot oven till brown. Remove to a plate and place a half of a canned pear and a little of the syrup in each. Beat one egg white till stiff and add one tablespoon of powdered sugar. Cover the pear with this and brown quickly in a hot oven.

Rhubarb Tart.
 Prepare one cup of stewed and sweetened rhubarb and thicken with two tablespoons of cornstarch mixed till smooth with a little cold water. Boil three minutes and cook in a double boiler thirty minutes. Cool. Bak a pastry shell, cool and spread with the rhubarb mixture. Cover with whipped cream.

PEARS BRING HIGH PRICE
 Medford, Ore., Oct. 20.—The largest one-day sale and the highest average price ever received for Rogue river pears was made in New York last week. Thirteen cars sold for an average of nearly \$3000 a car. One car of Anjous from Bear creek orchard sold for \$3869 or \$4 a half box.

Grants Pass, Ore., Oct. 20.—Renewed interest in mining properties changed hands in this section. The Dailey group has been taken over by the Josephine Mining and Developing company and the Western Metal Mines company has purchased the Standard mine at Alameda. Both are to be worked during the winter.
