CLEANLINESS
 In general Springfield's condition as to cleanliness is excellent. However, a few instances of filth have lately been observed. Most people are careful to keep their front yards and streets clean. But the alley is frequently used as a catch all, and at that never cleaned up.
 Instances are known where the refuse from the kitchens, tin cans, trash of all kinds, have been dumped into the alley, there to remain until it gradually disappears by the wear and tear of the traffic or the elements.
 This is the time of year when disease easily takes hold and if such conditions are allowed to remain, are

likely to cause serious trouble. Cleaning of the alleys ought not to wait until the general clean-up day, which usually comes in the spring. They should be cleaned up now and kept clean.
