### Frank J. Connolly Asks Help

Frank J. Connolly, veteran engineer for the Southern Pacific, in a personal plea to motorists, states that he is puzzled to know why automobile drivers not only risk their own lives, but the lives of those riding with them by trying to pass in front of swiftly moving trains.

"A fault wholly within the power of the driver of a machine to remedy," said Connolly, "is to drive right up to within ten or twenty feet of the track when he sees a train approaching, even when he intends to stop. You may have a right to do this, but it does not give the men on the engine a chance; they have no way of know-

ing whether you intend crossing the track or stopping until you get right on the track. Stop back or slow up 200 feet from the crossing. This will give us a chance and avoid many accidents. Also, when you hear a train approaching, do not take for granted that it is a freight train; it may be a fast passenger train, and such have the habit of creeping onto you before you know it. The best way is to stop and listen at railroad crossings—not just one of the passenger look, but stop all conversation until safely over all crossings."

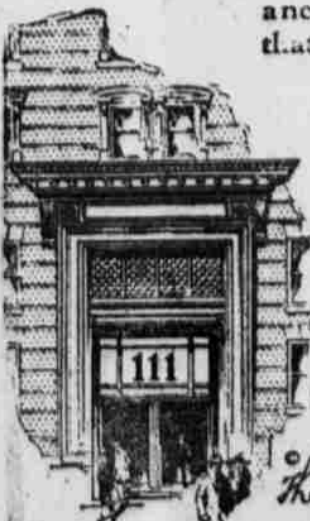
