## KELLY FOR GOVERNOR

A modest sized boom has been started for the nomination of George H. Kelly on the republican ticket for governor at the next general election. Mr. Kelly was well known here in the earlier years of the operations of the Booth-Kelly Lumber Co. He and R. A. Booth gave name to the company. Mr. Kelly saw service over seas in the world war, and attained the rank of lieutenant colonel. If he made a political campaign, of course it would be as "Col. Kelly." No doubt the citizens of Springfield, especially the older residents, irrespective of politics would feel a degree of pride in the fact that their town had furnished a candidate for the governorship. And to furnish the candidate on the republican ticket would be to furnish the governor, unless another Chamberlain should arise.

The 67th congress met in special session at the call of the president Monday noon. President Harding, following the precedent set by Wil-

son, delivered his message to congress in person, at 1 p. m. Tuesday, the two houses sitting jointly in the hall of representatives. The message was a rather long one, and is looked upon as a sort of declaration of policy of the incoming administration. While congress, during this special session, will have several great, and many minor problems of internal legislation to wrestle with, it seems probable that the settling of a policy of dealing with international relations will be the real bone of contention. This question will doubtless lead to a good deal of fencing for advantage of position and sparring for time, and may make the session a much longer one than was first expected.
