GRIT SUPPLY IS ESSENTIAL

Material Takes Place of Teeth in Preparing Fowl's Food for Fur. ther Digestion.

Grit is essential to the health of fowls and to economy in feeding. Grit takes the place of teeth in preparing the feed for further digestion and is required for the proper preparation of feed in the gizzard. When the feed is not properly taken care of in this organ, an undue strain is thrown on the fowl's system, often resulting in disease and also allowing much of the nutriment to pass through the bird's body without being absorbed. In every pen or yard a box of grit should be kept. Recent investigators have asserted that grit is a part of the necessary feed of a flock, giving the fowls strong bones and a bright plum-

Ordinarily, the hen does not consume enough lime to form the shells of eggs, if she is laying abundantly, unless something besides the ordinary grain feeds is accessible to her. Oyster shells are very good for this purpose. A box of crushed shells may be placed before the fowls, allowing them to eat at will. Old mortar and fine gravel are also useful in supplying lime, say poultry specialists of the United States Department of Agricul-

GEESE UNLIKE OTHER FOWLS

Best Results Obtained by Mating in Pairs During Breeding Season-Partial to Mates,

For best results geese should be mated in pairs during the breeding season. At least not more than two geese should be allowed for one gander. Geese are unlike any other farm poultry and are partial to their mates, A gander ought not to be kept more than three or four years, as an old gander is not a good breeder. From the other hand, females are more protific when they get older, and as a rule the eggs are more fertile. Females may be kept for eight or ten years or even longer.

Feeding Baby Chicks.

Young chicks should not be fed till 24 to 48 hours after hatching, and they will not suffer if given no feed until the third day.

SCOUT LEADERS ASSEMBLE

The eleventh annual meeting of the national council, Boys Scouts of America, took place at the Hotel Commodore, New York city, recently, with scout men to the number of 194 present, from 36 states, representing the enormous volunteer leadership of the country. These men come together every year to review the work of the past 12 months and to make plans for the future.

The spirit of the whole meeting was admirably expressed in the forceful phraseology of the Chief Scout Executive James E. West, as follows:

"It must be ever borne in mind that the basis of strength and power of the boy scout movement will not be measured alone by the number of scouts and scout officials, the records of activity of the national council, or number of local councils organized; these are but a means to an end. The value of the scout movement will be judged by the individual boy scout-his conduct, appearance, the way he puts into practice the scout oath and law and reveals that he is actually prepared to do things worth while because of the program of activities of the Boy Scouts of America."

Resolutions were passed endorsing the work of the Kiwanis and Rotary clubs in giving scouting and other boy programs generous support and sympathy and greetings were ordered sent to the boy scouts of Great Britain, France and Belgium, in particular, and to boy scouts everywhere throughout the world. It was also voted to continue the co-operation with the American committee for devastated France by again lending Lorne M. Barclay, director of the department of education of the national council for a period of six months to the work of the committee in France, looking forward to the development of scouting in France and particularly to assist in bringing about unification of the various branches of the scout movements in that country.

HONORS FOR BRAVE SCOUTS.

During the year 1920 the national court of honor of the Boy Scouts of America issued medals as follows to scouts for conspicuous service in life

saving and first aid: Two gold medals, 13 silver medals, 17 bronze medals. The gold medal cases were particularly striking, involving the heroic rescue of two children from a burning building by a young assistant scoutmaster, George Noble of Chariton, Ia., and another remarkably self-forgetful and fine aftempt on the part of a scout, Joseph Mardis of Troop No. 1, East Liverpool, to save his scoutmaster from a fallen live wire at the imminent risk of his own life. Nine of the silver medal cases were water accidents, and in each case the rescuer showed exceptional courage and clearheadedness. The other silver medal cases were a live wire rescue, the rescue of children from a burning building and

from automobile and truck accidents. The third scout law requires that a scout shall be prepared at any time to save life and help injured persons, and the records of the court of honor abundantly prove that the boys are living up to this obligation in full measure. In addition to these 32 medals already mentioned, 57 letters of commendation were sent by the court of honor to boys who performed deeds of exceptional excellence in life saving and first aid, without risk to their own lives.
