TAX DODGING ENCOURAGED

It is unfortunate that in order to pass what is often a meritorious piece of legislation, an entirely unfair and unnecessary clause will be inserted, which is a direct handicap to existing business.

The Federal Farm Loan Act offers a perfect illustration of such legislation.

The theory of the act was good—namely to furnish encouragement and assistance for farm development. But the bonds sold under the act to supply the money for loaning were made entirely tax exempt. No kind of taxes whatsoever can be charged the owner of the bonds.

This feature of the act should be remedied as it is unfair to all other lines of industry which must compete in the open market for money and whose securities are subject to every known form of taxation.

If the Federal Farm Loan Bonds were taxed the same as other bonds, it would not interfere with the working of the act and the farmers would still secure money under the favorable terms of the act.

Taxation of these bonds would, however, prevent hundreds of millions of dollars being withdrawn from the tax rolls by wealthy tax dodgers who thus leave the balance of the public to make up in taxation what they should be paying.
