FLUSHING THE SLOUGH

The water was turned into the
slough from the new dam, about the
last of last week. At first it made
considerable movement in the stag-
nant pools, and improved the sewage
conditions somewhat. A small chan-
nel had been cut through the west
end of the mole over which the rock
crusher men draw their gravel. Con-
siderable water was diverted into the
deep trench through which the gravel
is drawn. The flow of water through
the slough had almost ceased. Mon-
day, Mr. Donaldson and his force en-
larged the connecting channel oppo-
site the rock crusher, and built a
bridge over it. A good flow of water
has been set up, and the trouble is
probably averted for the season.
