Once again, as befits the autumn, brown and its tones is the popular color, and it comes in tints from Hight buff through gold and rust to a deep seal. Purple is also used, while gray and navy blue are of course in vogue. <br> For evening wear shades of red such as gayety, a deep rose, poppy red and aurora, a flame shot coral; together with blues, greens and rose oranges, are all to be worn.
