A boy was born to Mr. and Mrs. Walter Laxton, in the Eugene hospital, Tuesday morning.

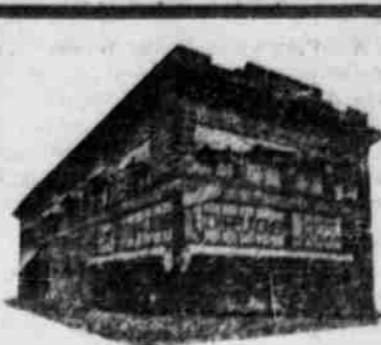

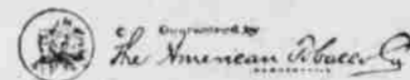
