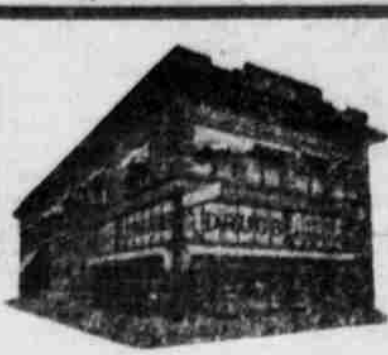

Notice is hereby given to the electors of the town of Springfield that there will be submitted to the said electors for their approval or rejection at a special election to be held in the town of Springfield, Oregon on the 27th day of September, 1921, an amendment to the charter of the town of Springfield, said amendment being "An Act to amend the Charter of the town of Springfield, Oregon by adding a new chapter thereto authorizing and empowering the Common Council of the town of Springfield to issue and sell the negotiable bonds of the town of Springfield to the amount of \$35,000.00 or so much thereof as the Common Council of the said town

may determine necessary for the purpose of paying and refunding outstanding general warrants of the town of Springfield drawn on the various funds and for various municipal purposes of said town."

The polling place for said election shall be in the town hall in the town of Springfield and the polls will be open from 8 o'clock a. m. until 8 o'clock p. m. on said day.

The following is the form and number in which the question will be submitted to the electors on the official ballot:

Proposed by resolution of the Common Council and referred to the electors.

Shall the charter of the town of Springfield be amended by adding a new chapter thereto authorizing and empowering the Common Council of the town of Springfield to issue and sell negotiable bonds of the town of Springfield to the amount of \$35,000.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of paying and refunding the outstanding general warrants of the town of Springfield drawn on the various funds of said town.
